Tim also took a spin on the Ohio Lady Pace and Made it the Annie Oakley Shootout which Top 8 ladies' race in and the purse is 3,000. Tim is trying to get a level "B" grand circuit race if you have good races people will come. Tim talked Burke's into bringing Foiled Again to Darke Co Fair this year. Tim spends hours upon hours getting Races and higher purses for Darke Co Fair. Tim's doings made it possible for the Darke Co Fair to be the Blue-Ribbon Fair for 2018.

Chris Gooden – Is the 2017 Post Time with Mike and Mike USTA Innovator of the Year. Chris's fantastic photos shower Facebook and Twitter and his promotion of The Meadows Racetrack and Casino is of highest regard. Gooden prides himself on taking different shots from many angles to ensure the best photo. His funny shots of Aaron Merriman are consistently a hit throughout social media.

Foiled Again Iron Horse of the Year

Montreal Phil - His dam Matter of Style was profiled in TROT Magazine this summer, because her last foal was racing well in Ontario Sires Stakes, & her first foal (Montreal Phil) was winstreaking at Truro Raceway at age 14! 15 wins in 21 tries this year--don't let weak NS overnight purse winnings (\$7,544) fool you. Breeder Tony Infilise was impressed Montreal Phil is still going strong. Montreal Phil has made just over \$700,000 in his career and has scored 84 career victories. From a win standpoint 2018 has been a career season for him with 15 victories in 23 starts this year.

Esprit De Kay Jay – Is a 14-year-old that began racing overseas in 2007 where he didn't have the best of racing luck. Since coming to the United States, he has made just over \$400,000 in earnings while winning 64 total races. In 2018 he has 9 victories in 20 starts with just under \$20,000 made. In his career, Espirit De Kay Jay has made over \$680,000 in 281 career starts.

Victorys Peanut - 14-year-old horse proudly owned by the Leon family, he has over \$180,000 in lifetime earnings and 39 lifetime wins. This horse races his heart every time he races and has become a fan favorite horse at Leamington Raceway after he retires he stay at the Leon farm for

his retirement. Victorys Peanut has 39 wins in 286 career starts with just over \$160,000 in career earnings. In 2018 he has four wins in 35 starts with just under \$15,000 in the bank.

Quicksilvercandy A - She began her winning ways by capturing a matinee race in the Cradle of the Trotter at Goshen Historic Track in Goshen, NY. Quicksilvercandy A successfully raced against Open mares at Pocono and Yonkers. She set her lifetime mark of 1:51.2 at the Downs at Mohegan Sun Pocono. She has won 77-lifetime races and has earnings in upwards of \$737,000. She was also nominated in 2017.

Intheblinkofaneye - Is a thirteen-year-old standardbred pacer, this horse has been through so many stables, and not one has had a bad word to say about him, Megan Roberts has the pleasure of owning him now and this horse has the most heart I've ever seen in a racehorse, always gives 110% even with have metal in his knees and arthritis, he truly loves his job. He's a character in the barn and he's always the first one to greet you. He currently has 43 victories in 168 career starts with just over \$400,00 in career earnings. In 2018, he has three wins in 19 starts with just under \$20,000 bankrolled.

B Blissful – Took on one of his toughest tests when he faced Foiled Again this year at Shenandoah Downs in Virginia. Throughout his lengthy career he has raced at some of racing's top tracks and while he was never a major producer of money earned, he was a very consistent horse. He currently has 60 wins in 299 starts with \$320,000 in the bank.

Horsewoman of the Year

Jessica Otten - A Michigan Native and is currently enrolled at Mott Community College majoring in business management. She helped make her presence felt in the sport of harness racing by providing behind-the-scenes access to the happenings at Northville Downs. Otten is a pivotal part of the Post Time with Mike and Mike live broadcast team and has grown as a

broadcaster since joining the team. Jessica was recently hired by Meadowlands Racing and Entertainment. This is Otten's third Post Time with Mike and Mike awards nomination

Nancy Johansson – Is the well-known daughter of hall of fame trainer Jimmy Takter who currently trains numerous horses including Kissin' In The Sand. Johansson has just under 200 career victories as a trainer and has made over \$7.7 million in earnings.

JoAnn Looney-King – Is the high-profile trainer of Shartin N who has dominated the Open Mare ranks since coming overseas. She is also the mother of Heather Vitale. King has been known throughout the sport of harness racing for her super happy reactions in the winners' circle following seeing her horses score victories. King was the 2016 Small Stable of the Year winner.

Wendy Ross – Began working for the USTA in May 2018, helping to spearhead some of harness racing's mainstream media. She helped to produce and put together the first harness racing Lip Sync battle and also helped put on a Harness Racing Carpool Karaoke. She worked with Mark Weaver and Ron Burke to coordinate the Harness Racing FanZone Foiled Again Farewell tour.

Casie Coleman – Currently has the horse to beat in training right now in McWicked. Coleman has worked tirelessly throughout her career to put together the powerhouse stable that she has currently. Coleman statistically has over 2,300 career wins with over \$57 million in career earnings.

Moira Fanning – Is currently the COO of the Hambletonian Society. Fanning assists with everything there is to work with when it comes to Grand Circuit events. She works tirelessly behind the scenes to ensure that things get done correctly and in a timely manner.

Larry Rheinheimer Small Stable of the Year

Altmeyer Wilder Racing Stable – A family run operation that focuses on racing at The Meadows Racetrack and Casino. The stable name comes from the marriage of Heather Wilder (Altmeyer) and Mike Wilder. Their stable currently has 13 horses in their stable. Mike is the second trainer and driver of the stable, while Heather owns several horses within the barn and manages their social media accounts. The stable took in Mr Bill G the Pacing for the Cure mascot in 2018 and since entering their stable has scored two victories.

Go Where The Money Is Stable – Has approx. 10 horses with 20 partners in their stable currently. They race primarily at Vernon Downs in upstate NY where they have had plenty of success. Their partners come out almost every time they race and have a great time. They enthusiastically promote the sport from the perspective of the little guy

Jeff Lilley Stable - Jeff has a small stable of just a few horses, but this year, 2018, Jeff managed a great-granddaughter of Cecily to become the Maritime 3-year-old filly of the year, and the richest Maritime-bred ever for a single season with earnings of over \$100,000. It's been an incredible success story. Jeff works constantly to promote the industry and attract new owners to it.

Verlin Yoder – Is known for producing some of racing's best trotters including champion Natural Herbie, but in 2018 he produced an unbeaten Indiana-bred named Woodside Charm. Woodside Charm not only took the Indiana Super Final but also scored a victory in the 2018 Breeders Crown.

Scott Betts Stable – This small stable has just under \$1,000,000 in career earnings with over 100 career training victories. 2018 has been a breakout year for them while racing at The Meadows Racetrack and Casino. In 2018, he has made just under \$500,000 in earnings.

Winners Circle Racing – Is a fractional ownership group that provides the total harness racing experience: from the barn to the paddock to the winners' circle. The group was started by Charlie Longo and Matt Zuccarello, both US Trotting Association Driving School graduates. Their mission is to introduce as many people to the sport as possible.
